

Examining Our Faith - Facilitated by Steve Minnich

The Greek word for faith appears two hundred forty-three in the New Testament. Its usage can refer to at least two different but related concepts. The lessons for this quarter will explore the significance of faith and how the people of God live by faith. During Jesus' ministry, he interacted with Jews and Gentiles. One shocking thing in the Gospels is how many stories highlight people outside of Jewish ancestry exercising faith in Christ. Jesus even told a centurion that his faith was greater than any faith Jesus found in Israel (Matthew 8:10)! Most of us are outside of Jewish ancestry, so these teachings apply perfectly to each of us. Join us and consider these timeless truths from the Bible.



JAM Rec Center Updates


























Here are a few highlights:




