## 🐌 Ed's 2 Cents 🍕



On Easter Sunday we will joyfully consider how Christ's resurrection on the third day confirms his sacrifice on the cross, with teaching that comes from the Gospel of Matthew 27. Finally, Christ, the glorious Lamb who was slain and whose blood has "purchased" us for God, will be celebrated as we study Revelation 5 and talk about the throne room of Heaven where the glorious Lamb is declared "worthy"!



### "James for Everyone" by NT Wright Men Only - Room 202



Join us for nine studies on James's passionate letter intended to help us live out a faith that makes a difference. Every generation in the church worries, rightly, about people who just glide along, seeming to enjoy what they hear in church but without it making any real difference. James faced exactly the same problem in the very first generation. So it's not surprising that translating belief into action--making sure faith is the real thing--is near the heart of his message. That kind of faith, he explains, is the faith that matters, the faith that justifies, the faith that saves. We need that kind of faith today.



If you've ever wondered what is behind the door in the front of the sanctuary that has the sign "Prayer Place" over the top, here's a little peek...

You need to know that the "Prayer Place" has always been a stairway to connect the sanctuary to the lower level of the church. However, twenty years ago a group of women, led by Norma Minnich, worked to transform that area from a stairwell to a place of prayer. Painting and beautiful decor prepared a place for the newly established prayer ministry.

When the ministry was initiated we had prayer partners praying in the room during both services. There were sixteen people involved - either two men or two women covering the service in prayer - WOW! It was an exciting time, as prayer was offered during the service AND people were available to pray with anyone who came up to the prayer area at the end of the service.

The prayer room has served as a location for intercession since that time. Though the decor has changed, its purpose has remained the same - to praise God and bring our needs to Him. We would welcome anyone who wants to become a part of the prayer ministry by spending one service a month praying for Bethesda and our needs in our prayer room. 
